After the Death of
Houston Police Officer Eydelmen Mani**

The 100 Club announced today that donations are being accepted to its “Survivor’s Fund” which provides benefits to the dependents of peace officers and firefighters who are killed in the line of duty.

Officer Eydelmen Mani, 30, died in the line of duty on Wednesday morning, May 19, 2010, after his patrol car crashed while on his way to assist with a high speed chase.

Officer Mani had been an Officer with the Houston Police Department for seven years. He is survived by his wife and a three year old son.

A \$10,000 check will be given to Officer Mani’s family to assist with any needs they may have. Additional financial support for the family will be provided, after a review is made by the Club, to include current financial and children’s educational needs.
