**100 Club Requests Donations to “Survivor’s Fund”
After the Death of
Houston DEA Agent Thomas Byrne**

The 100 Club announced today that donations are being accepted to its “Survivor’s Fund” which provides benefits to the dependents of peace officers and firefighters who are killed in the line of duty.

Houston Drug Enforcement Agency Supervisory Agent Thomas Byrne, 40, died in the line of duty on August 30, 2008 after being murdered in New Orleans. Agent Byrne is survived by his wife, Maureen, and 4 young boys ranging in age from 2 to 8 years old.

A \$10,000 check will be given to Agent Byrne’s family to assist with any needs they may have. Additional financial support for the Byrne family will be provided, after a review, to include current financial and children’s educational needs, is made by the Club.
