100 Club Provides Financial Support to Family of Slain Liberty County Deputy Sheriff

100 Club President N.M. "Mack" Brown announced that The 100 Club will present a financial gift to the widow and daughter of slain Liberty County Sheriff's Deputy Will Agy during an 11:30 am ceremony in Dayton, Texas at Frank's Cafe on Highway 90.

Deputy Agy was killed in the line of duty while working an off-duty security job at a southwest Houston shopping strip center on April 5, 1995 when armed gunmen entered a video store, Agy frequented while on his rounds, in what appears to have been an effort to hijack the store. Agy, working in his Sheriff's Department uniform was quickly spotted by the gunmen and forced to the floor of the store where witnesses say he was murdered. Deputy Agy is survived by his wife Rita, a grown daughter Ali and daughter Tracy age 15.

The 100 Club gift of \$100,000 is in addition to a \$10,000 gift presented to Ms. Agy shortly after her husband was killed in the line of duty. The gift provides \$65,000 in benefits for Ms. Agy and \$35,000 in benefits, beginning at age 18, for her daughter Tracy.

The 100 Club is a non-profit organization of 11,000 members which provides financial support to the dependents of law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty, provides life-protecting and special needs equipment to law enforcement agencies and provides educational opportunities to law enforcement officers in Ft. Bend, Harris and Montgomery counties. Deputy Agy's family was covered by the 100 Club because the club policy provides support for officers from outside the 3 county area who are killed in the line of duty in either of the 3 counties.
