**100 Club Requests Donations to “Survivor’s Fund” After
the Death of
Wharton County Game Warden Justin Hurst**

The 100 Club announced today that donations are being accepted to its “Survivor’s Fund” which provides benefits to the dependents of peace officers and firefighters who are killed in the line of duty.

Game Warden Justin Hurst, 34, was murdered by a suspect with an automatic rifle and pistol early Saturday Morning, March 17, 2007, his birthday. Game Warden Hurst is survived by his wife, and a 4 month old child.

A \$10,000 check will be given immediately to Game Warden Hurst’s family to assist with any needs they may have. Additional financial support for the Hurst family will be provided, after a review, to include current financial and children’s educational needs, is made by the Club.
