**100 Club Requests Donations to “Survivor’s Fund”
After the Death of TDCJ Officer
Susan Canfield**

The 100 Club announced today that donations are being accepted to its “Survivor’s Fund” which provides benefits to the dependents of peace officers, firefighters and State Correctional Officers who are killed in the line of duty.

TDCJ Officer Susan Canfield, 59, was murdered Monday afternoon, September 24, 2007 when she was run over by a vehicle stolen by two escaped convicts from the TDCJ Wynne Unit in Huntsville. Correctional Officer Canfield was taken to a local hospital where she died a short time later. Correctional Officer Canfield is survived by her husband, Charles, a Houston Police Officer and three grown children.

A \$10,000 check will be given immediately to Officer Canfield’s family to assist with any needs they may have. Additional financial support for the family will be provided, after a review, to include current financial needs, is made by the Club.
